Neither Should You

Get checked.

Early detection saves lives. Screening tests can find cancer before it spreads, and when it's easier to treat. Start a tradition of prevention. Taking care of your health is important.



Breast cancer

Women should review their breast cancer risk with their medical provider starting at age 25. Women ages 40 and older should receive an annual mammogram.



Cervical cancer

Women ages 21-29 should be screened with a Pap smear every three years. Women 30 - 65 should be screened with a Pap smear and HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) test every 5 years.



Colorectal cancer

Colorectal cancer screening should begin at age 40-45 (early screening for Alaska Native or American Indian persons or those with other risk factors). There are several different tests; talk with a health care provider about which test is best for you.



Lung cancer

If you are a current or former smoker age 50-80, you may be eligible for lung cancer screening with a low-dose CT scan. Review your risk with your medical provider.
