SEARHC offers a wide range of behavioral health services including outpatient psychiatric care, mental health, and comprehensive addiction services. Additionally, we provide a residential youth program focused on mental health. Behavioral health services vary by site and program. SEARHC provides services in person, by phone or over other approved telehealth platforms. Please contact your local clinic or provider for more information on which services are offered locally.

The People We Serve

SEARHC provides services to children, adolescents and adults who choose to address their mental health or substance use issues. SEARHC provides community-based behavioral health, psychiatric, psychiatric emergency, and comprehensive addiction services. In addition, SEARHC has a Residential Youth Program for adolescents who are severely, emotionally disturbed.

Bringing Healing Closer to Home

SEARHC provides services throughout Southeast Alaska. The Behavioral Health department provides services primarily in Haines, Juneau, Ketchikan, Klawock, Petersburg, Sitka and Wrangell, with traveling, in-person clinics operating in Angoon, Hoonah, Hydaburg, Kake and Klukwan. Comprehensive addiction services, including Opioid Treatment Programs are offered in Juneau, Sitka, Klawock and most recently, Ketchikan. Additionally, tele-health services are provided to patients residing in Alaska.



Outpatient Behavioral Health Services

SEARHC offers community-based outpatient services to individuals and families with diagnosed behavioral health conditions. All services begin with a comprehensive evaluation and treatment plan. Depending on the client's treatment plan, supportive care can include therapy-based services, family support services, conflict resolution skills, fundamental community living skills, productive behavior modeling, problem-solving skills building, services and supports connecting, community agencies and in-home services advocacy.

Treatment Approach/Goals

Our goal is to help you achieve the therapeutic goals that you establish with your treatment team. We believe the best treatment outcomes are achieved when there is an open and honest partnership between the patient and the care team. We take a whole person approach to patient care. In this spirit, we work alongside our clients to develop a holistic understanding of the biological, psychological and cultural aspects of their mental health and substance use concerns.

Care Team

Qualifications include psychiatrists, nurses, therapists, counselors, behavioral health aides, case managers and other support staff. As clinic staffing varies by facility, please contact your local clinic to inquire.

SEARHC's behavioral health services are offered to all children, adolescents and adults in Southeast Alaska, who have emotional and mental health concerns.

Facilities

Settings include SEARHC offices and community-based facilities, as appropriate (i.e., school, work or library). Other settings may include tele-behavioral health services, offering video or phone-only services.

Psychiatric Services

SEARHC's psychiatric prescribers take a whole person approach to patient care. Once a comprehensive evaluation is completed, our prescribers take an evidence-based approach to medication management and work in partnership with our clients, our team and medical providers to achieve the best results.

Our prescribers provide psychiatric assessments and treatment including psychopharmacology when indicated, for children, adolescents, and adults with psychiatric mood and behavioral disorders, including depression, other mood disorders, anxiety, psychosis, attention deficit hyperactivity disorders and disruptive behaviors.

Settings include SEARHC offices in Juneau, Sitka, Klawock and traveling clinics as available. Services are available in-person or via tele-health.

Monday-Friday 8 a.m.- 5 p.m.

SEARHC provides compassionate, evidence-based treatment and recovery services for Southeast Alaskans struggling with substance addiction, including alcohol, opioids, stimulants and more. Recovery is not about a cure; it is about healing and restoration and SEARHC is here to help.

Utilizing an innovative blend of in-person and virtual options, SEARHC Comprehensive Addiction Services (CAS) are available throughout the region.

Residential Youth Services

SEARHC Raven's Way provides individualized, strengths-based services to children and their families, in the most comfortable and least restrictive setting. The programs at our SEARHC Raven's Way campus simulate home-like environments that emphasize the development of positive, nurturing relationships. We offer social and recreational opportunities because we believe they assist in the child's development and a successful return to the community. SEARHC provides residential treatment for youth ages 12 to 18 on our Raven's Way Campus in Juneau. Residents receive individual, group and family counseling. They also go through skill-building and educational programming, according to their treatment plans.

Services

Includes an individualized treatment and safety plan upon admission to the program; comprehensive clinical services including integrated behavioral health, individual therapy, group therapy and family therapy, psychiatric assessments and medication management conducted by a psychiatrist; and professional case management services to coordinate medical and educational services as well as aftercare planning.

Treatment Approach/Goals

The program is strength-based and uses the "Teaching Family Model," an evidenced-based system of care that offers daily opportunities for emotional, relational and social skills learning. Our primary goals are to help the child achieve the therapeutic goals that they establish with their treatment team and maintain or reunite the child with their family when it is in the child's best interest. We take a whole person approach to patient care. In this spirit, we work alongside our clients to develop a holistic understanding of the biological, psychological and cultural aspects of their mental health and substance use concerns.

Care Team

Staff qualifications include therapists, behavioral health aides, case managers and other support staff.

Our Patients

Target population includes youth ages 12 to 18 that are severely emotionally disturbed.

Facilities

Settings include SEARHC residential facilities and community-based settings as appropriate.



Hours

24-hour residential program. Office hours are Monday- Friday 9 a.m.- 6 p.m.

Frequency

Continuous 24-hour care is provided.

SEARHC accepts self-pay and insured patients. SEARHC's Patient Health Benefits team provides help at no cost to the patient, in signing up for health insurance and our Financial Assistance Program.

Psychiatric Emergency Services

SEARHC provides support for psychiatric emergency services in Haines, Klawock, Petersburg, Sitka and Wrangell. In these communities trained staff are available to assist in providing emergency mental health services 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Local staff will assist in providing community-based services or assess clients to determine the need for a referral to higher levels of services that can help.

We believe the best treatment outcomes are achieved when there is a partnership between the patient and the treatment team. Our goal for crisis services is to help you achieve safety and stability. We take a whole person approach to patient care. In this spirit, we work alongside our clients to develop a holistic understanding of the biological, psychological, and cultural aspects of their mental health and substance use concerns.

Our Patients

Population served includes children, adolescents and adults who are experiencing a crisis.

Care Team

Staff qualifications include therapists, counselors, behavioral health aides, case managers and other support staff. Clinic staffing varies, contact your local clinic to inquire.

Facilities

Settings include SEARHC offices, emergency departments, police departments, or other community settings, as appropriate.

After hours in person response is limited to Haines, Klawock, Petersburg, Sitka and Wrangell clinic or hospital locations. In some instances, after-hours reporting to local jails is also available in the communities listed above.

Hours

Haines, Klawock, Petersburg, Sitka and Wrangell have on-call clinicians available 24/7. Other clinics offer walk in based crisis services during normal business hours.

Frequency

Frequency of services will vary depending on the acuity of the crisis.
